



# CELEBRATING PAKISTAN'S ANCIENT ARCHEOLOGICAL HERITAGE

Pakistan, a cradle of ancient civilizations, boasts a rich history that dates back to one of the earliest agricultural settlements in the world, established around 6000 BC. The Indus Valley Civilization, which flourished between 2600 and 1900 BC, is notable for the advanced urban centres of Harappa and Mohenjo-Daro. This civilization is recognized globally for its sophisticated city planning, architectural brilliance, and intricate social systems. Between 200 BC to 800 AD, the Gandhara Civilization also thrived in this region, becoming a major spiritual and cultural hub.

Pakistan's rich heritage is evident in its numerous archeological sites, which offer a unique insight into the lives of those who shaped the early history of South Asia. These historical treasures testify to Pakistan's deep cultural roots and diversity. Sites like Mohenjo-Daro, Harappa, and Taxila, along with others, are not only archeological marvels but also symbols of ancient urban sophistication and cultural richness, reflecting Pakistan's wealth of UNESCO designated World Heritage Sites.

To enhance the domestic and international focus on this rich heritage, the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI) is organizing a one-day International Conference titled "Celebrating Pakistan's Ancient Archeological and Civilizational Heritage" on 30 September 2024. The Conference aims to highlight the global significance of Pakistan's heritage with a special focus on strategies for preservation, conservation, and the development of sustainable tourism.

- 2. Reflecting on Pakistan's Rich Heritage

  This session will focus on the preservation and conservation strategies for iconic sites such as Mohenjo-Daro and Harappa among others. It will discuss best practices, challenges, and innovative approaches to ensure that Pakistan's archaeological treasures are protected and appreciated by future generations.
- 3. Building Bridges Through Cultural Tourism
  This session will explore tourism models and how they can be harnessed to build bridges across cultures. It will highlight initiatives aimed at developing tourism that supports local economies, preserves heritage sites, and provides enriching experiences for visitors.

The event will bring together scholars, policymakers, cultural experts, and other relevant stakeholders to forge partnerships. Participants will engage in panel discussions, designed to foster international collaboration and mutual understanding.
